I was born in South Africa and have lived in Sydney since 1988. Although my immediate family did not experience the Holocaust, I have always been deeply affected when meeting survivors, finding their personal histories inspiring lessons for life. This interest has led me to become a volunteer guide at the Sydney Jewish Museum.

I am also involved in a Custodian Program, in which a younger person is matched with a survivor and through a very personal relationship takes on the survivor's story. This program was piloted at the 2011 Gloucester Courage to Care exhibition.

As a parent, I feel especially passionate about my work as a guide in the Courage to Care program, which aims to empower students to make good decisions in tricky situations like bullying and discrimination that require courage and strength of character. The program demonstrates to students how each one of us can make a difference and how in this way our schools and work places will become more caring and respectful environments.
